NNECA 40: THE SPEAKERS



Dr. Diana Butler Bass is an author, speaker, and independent scholar specializing in American religion and culture. She holds a Ph.D. in religious studies from Duke University and is the author of seven books including *A People's History of Christianity: the Other Side of the Story* (HarperOne, 2009). Her best-selling *Christianity for the Rest of Us* (2006) was named as one of the best religion books of the year by *Publishers Weekly* and *Christian Century*, won the Book of the Year Award from the Academy of Parish Clergy, and was featured in a cover story in *USA TODAY*. www.dianabutlerbass.com



The Rev. Dr. Bruce Epperly is a teacher, spiritual guide, writer, lecturer, retreat leader, and reiki teacher. The author of sixteen books, he is Professor of Practical Theology and Continuing Education at Lancaster Theological Seminary in Lancaster, Pennsylvania. An ordained minister in the United Church of Christ and Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), he is also co-pastor with his wife, Rev. Kate Epperly, D.Min., of Disciples United Community Church in Lancaster, PA. He regularly lectures, leads workshops and retreats, and gives reiki trainings throughout the United States and Canada. www.bruceepperly.com

The Rt. Rev. Nathan Dwight Baxter, is the 10th bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Central Pennsylvania. A third generation clergyman, he was dean of Washington National Cathedral from 1991 to 2003 and served as Chief Administrative Officer of the Protestant Episcopal Church Foundation. Baxter served as the administrative dean and associate professor of Pastoral Theology at Episcopal Divinity School in Cambridge, Massachusetts, seminary dean and associate professor of Church and Ministry at Lancaster Theological Seminary in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, and chaplain and professor of Religious Studies at St. Paul's College in Lawrenceville, Virginia. Bishop Baxter has also served parishes in Pennsylvania and Virginia.



The Rev. Dr. Todd Farley is a citizen of the world. He spent his early childhood in Hawaii and his arts training in Paris, France ('84-'87) under the tutelage of the legendary Marcel Marceau. Todd began ministry as a mime in 1978, in 1989 he was ordained as a minister, and since that time he has worked with churches, parachurch organizations, and institutions of higher learning throughout the world. He is an internationally recognized authority on mime, arts, theology and creative preaching.
