The Church of the Advent hosts three 12-step groups every week and has hosted such groups for over 50 years.

The service of Faith and Recovery is built on top of the 12-step program and will include the Holy Eucharist.

ALL are welcome. The service is directed toward all of those involved in the recovery process, including every one they love and everyone who loves them.

The Episcopal Church has, since the founding of the 12-step programs in 1935, been a strong advocate, collaborator and supporter of Alcoholics Anonymous. The Rev. Sam Shoemaker, an Episcopal priest who served in Pittsburgh, was deeply involved from the very outset.

The 12-step program finds its roots in the Christian scriptures and especially the Beatitudes. (Matthew 5:3-11).



In the past we've had very rewarding experiences repacking food ranging from cereals to oranges. The Food Bank is always well organized and makes excellent use of our volunteer time.

The grants are primarily designed for ministries within the diocese and with the goal of even distribution across all districts. It is hoped that these small grants will enable the continuation of existing ministries on the local level. However, the ECW will continue its policy of also awarding grants to some national and international ministries such as Episcopal Relief & Development.



2017 Parochial Reports Due March 1

Parishes are reminded that Parochial Reports for the year 2017 are due by March 1, 2018. Reports can be filed through the Episcopal Church's online reporting system, or completed paper copies can be mailed to the diocesan office. For those who file electronically, a signed paper copy should also be submitted to the diocesan office.



Once filed, all parochial reports must be reviewed and certified by the diocese. This year, because of General Convention, the deadline for diocesan review is much earlier than usual and must be completed by May 1st. It is therefore especially important for parishes to make sure their filing deadline of March 1st is met.

It is the joint responsibility of clergy and vestry to assure the timely completion of parochial reports. A blank report form as well as instructions and detailed workbooks for help in filing each page of the report are available online at www.episcopalchurch.org/posts/research/parochial-report
