



## Funding/Supplies

- Funding:
  - ▶ Direct parish/community support/fundraisers
  - ▶ Diocesan mission grants
  - ▶ ECW grants
  - ▶ Foundation and government agency grants
- Supplies:
  - Parish food/product drives
  - ▶ Local supermarkets/bakeries/pharmacies/retailers
  - ► Local ministerium (I.E., SHIM gardens)
  - ► Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank
  - Corporate charitable departments (I.E., HomeGoods)
  - ▶ Economy of scale savings with other similar organizations

- Our clients are typically dealing with some sort of crisis, are often transient, and have little or no resources like phones, housing or transportation for follow-up or access to resources
