
Welcome (Back) Bishop Price!





Parish Audit Reports Due September 1

All parishes are reminded that the completed Parish Audit Reports are due in the diocesan office by September 1, 2019.

Diocesan Canon XVII, Section 5 states:

All reports of such audits, including any memorandum issued by the auditors or audit committee regarding internal controls or other accounting matters, together with a summary of action taken or proposed to be taken to correct deficiencies or implement recommendations contained in any such memorandum, shall be filed with the Bishop or



Ecclesiastical Authority not later than 30 days following the date of such report, and in no

event, **not later than September 1** of each year covering the financial report of the previous calendar year.
