In a time when the current climate of our political and social life is marked by polarity and fear, our society has great need for the alternative offered by our faith. St. Paul boldly announces that, "in Christ God was reconciling the world to Himself" (2 Corinthians 5:19). The work of the Church, therefore, is the ministry of reconciliation, and nowhere is this more urgent than in the call to heal the wounds of racial injustice that have so marked our history. This workshop gives us some critical tools to begin the work.

This training is required of all elected leadership, lay and ordained, in the Diocese of Pittsburgh, including all candidates for Holy Orders. There is no fee for the training, but a free-will offering will help offset the cost of the food and refreshments.



## 2019 CROP Hunger Walks

For fifty years, the interfaith organization <u>Church</u> <u>World Service</u> has sponsored *CROP Hunger Walks* to raise funds and awareness to combat hunger here at home and around the world.



The diocesan Social Justice and Outreach Committee invites all Episcopalians to join their neighbors to help provide food, water, and partnership in development for those in need. Some contribute by walking, others by sponsoring a walker or their community walk as a whole.

In our area, walks are scheduled in Elizabeth-Forward on September 29; Greensburg on October 6; the East End, South Hills, Penn-Trafford, Murrysville, and Indiana, all on October 13; and Ligonier on October 20.

The East End walk, starting at 2 p.m. on Saturday, October 13, begins and ends at South Avenue United Methodist Church at 733 South Avenue in Wilkinsburg with a six mile route to Squirrel Hill and back. A shorter one-mile route is also planned.



The grants are primarily designed for ministries within the diocese and with the goal of even distribution across all districts. It is hoped that these small grants will enable the continuation of existing ministries on the local level. However, the ECW will continue its policy of also awarding grants to some national and international ministries such as Episcopal Relief & Development.

## **ECW Fall 2019 Scholarships Available**

The Episcopal Church Women established the Memorial Membership Fund to aid students with educational grants. The fund was begun in 1927 to be used for two missionary training scholarships. In the 92 years of its existence, the scope of the fund has widened to include nursing, theology and other humanitarian fields of study.



Funds are raised through gifts from individuals or groups in memory of a loved one or friend. This money is invested and the interest used for the granting purposes.

## Each applicant must:


- be an Episcopalian in good standing (active) in a parish in the Diocese of Pittsburgh,
- · have completed one year of college or the equivalent,
- be pursuing education in either church or humanitarian related fields,
- · submit an application, including a letter stating goals and need, and
- submit a reference letter from their parish priest.

The Memorial Membership Committee will consider each request based on individual need and circumstances. Scholarships are completely unencumbered and may be used as needed to aid the recipient in achieving their educational goals. Each eligible applicant is able to apply once a year for three years.

## The Very Rev. Richard Pocalyko, 1946-2019

Dean of Trinity Cathedral, 2000-2004

The Very Reverend Richard (Rich) Peter Pocalyko, 72, of Atlanta, passed away at home on August 21, 2019.



Rich was born on November 15, 1946 in Palmerton, PA, to Peter and Ruth Norwood Pocalyko. Rich is a graduate of Lehigh University (1968) and Virginia Theological Seminary (1971). He attended Princeton Theological Seminary and Fuller Theological Seminary for doctoral studies.

Rich was ordained to the Episcopal priesthood at Washington National Cathedral in 1972. Rich served as Assoc. Rector of St. Andrew's (College Park, MD), Assoc. Rector of St. Luke's (Atlanta, GA), Rector of St. Dunstan's (Atlanta, GA), Canon for Stewardship Development and Associate for Pastoral Care at the Cathedral of St. Philip (Atlanta, GA), and Dean of Trinity Cathedral (Pittsburgh, PA).

Rich is survived by his wife of 50 years, Cynthia Austin Pocalyko; son, Stephen Pocalyko; daughters and sons-in-law, Jennifer and Todd Latz, Lara and Jeff Walker; grandchildren, Alex, Sophie, and Gaby Latz, and Preston Walker; brother, Barry L. Pocalyko and sister-in-law Betty Austin Lewis.
