### **Update Your Place!**

EPISC PALASSET MAP

The Episcopal Asset Map is the tool that

the diocese uses on the web as its "Parish Finder" for those that are seeking a parish that fits their needs.

With the Episcopal Asset Map, each parish has the opportunity to tell the Church and the world about how your congregation is being called to serve God and neighbor. When you share your faith

stories, worship styles, ministries, and more, you are providing visitors with information that can help them as they discern where the Spirit is calling.

During this period of Virtual Worship, the map provides an opportunity to point visitors to the place that you hold your services, whether on your website, in social media or via video conferencing.

Each parish has the ability to update their own listing. **YOU DO NOT NEED TO LOG IN TO ADD INFORMATION**. Simply find your parish on the map, click "Update this place," add or edit the information, then click save and submit. The diocesan office will review your changes and make them public, usually within hours of the submission.



#### **SJO Awards Garden Grants**

The diocesan Social Justice and Outreach Committee (SJO) is pleased to announce the awarding of four \$500 grants to the following applicants for 2020:

SJO's goal with the grants is to create supplies of locally grown produce for our neighbors in need. Depending on the location and circumstance, they expect that such produce will be distributed through local food pantries or parish-based outreach efforts. Tending these gardens also provides opportunities for youth participation and collaboration with neighboring community members outside the congregations.

#### **Virtual Services With Virtual Choirs**

During these uncertain times, our parishes have been creative in the ways that they have been able to bring worship to their parish families. There is an amazing variety of service styles available from our <u>list of streaming services</u>.

One real challenge is how to incorporate the choir into the mix.

Two or our parishes have found innovative ways to incorporate their choirs into their services, Church of the Redeemer in Squirrel Hill and St. Brendan's in Franklin Park.



Joan Gundersen from Redeemer explains how they creatively added music to their Easter services:

"Nine parish members who sing with the choir participated, about half of the full choir. It was a real learning curve since some of the members had never used their computers/tablets/phones to record anything before. Each had to record themselves singing it while listening on earphones to the accompaniment recorded by our organist/choir director, Ann Labounsky. All the recordings reached me late on Maundy Thursday. My husband, Bob, then spent the next two days working with video and sound editing to create the final product. It was ready for inclusion in both the Vigil and Easter Sunday services."

St. Brendan's April 19 service featured a virtual "Halle Hallelujah" choir. Their offering includes more than 35 voices and they plan to expand it to over 100 voices.
