Union of Black Episcopalians Churchwide Revival



It's time to register for the Union of Black Episcopalians (UBE) 53rd Annual Conference, scheduled for July 27-30, 2021

The 2021 conference – a completely virtual event – will take the form of a Revival, with plenary panel discussions, breakouts, lively worship and parties.

The event will feature celebration of the 40th Anniversary of the original Lift Every Voice and Sing hymnal; celebration of the life of the first female bishop in the Anglican Communion, the late Rt. Rev. Barbara Harris (1930-2020); and exclusive attendance at a book-launch to meet the six pioneers who are our first Black female diocesan bishops.

Facing the Rising Sun

There will be special programming by and for youth and young adults (YAYA), plus games and activities for children under 13. The youth and young adults will offer a program on YAYA Day, sharing a lens for looking into the future; and they promise a rousing YAYA worship service followed by a mixer and "dance party to end all parties." Such a fitting end to the UBE 2021 Conference and Churchwide Revival.
