The Beloved Community Initiative (BCI) seeks to promote the liberating and reconciling love of Jesus Christ, particularly as it relates to racial justice and reconciliation. The BCI will serve specifically to develop strategies, as informed by the gospel of Jesus Christ, our Baptismal Covenant and our diocesan mission.





90-Day Racial Equity Challenge (August Through October)

- Every day for 3 weeks, do one action to further your understanding of power, privilege, supremacy, oppression, and equity. This can be done within a group of friends, an organization or workplace, or on your own. - During week 4, join others in a "Service of Sharing and Celebration."
- Repeat over a three month period.
