#### **Overdose Awareness Day: A Time to Remember**

Deaths by overdose accelerated during the COVID-19 pandemic. Each person lost to overdose is a person precious to God and created in God's image. Together, we can remember them in prayer and support those left behind.

Our region will observe International Overdose Awareness Day at **Noon on Friday, August 27,** with a memorial at <u>Trinity</u> <u>Cathedral</u>, 328 Sixth Avenue in Downtown Pittsburgh. The interfaith service includes prayers from faith leaders, testimonies from survivors, and blessings for first responders.



Preceding the service, the cathedral bells will toll for each overdose death in Allegheny County.


The Resolutions Committee is now accepting items to be considered at convention.

## **Episcopal Historians Recognize Canonsburg Parishioner's Research**

Samuel J. Richards received an honorable mention during the <u>Historical Society of</u> the <u>Episcopal Church</u> annual meeting on Wednesday, July 28, for his research titled "Historical Revision in Church: Re-examining the 'Saint' Edward Colston."

The article appeared in the September 2020 issue of Anglican and Episcopal History, the society's peer-reviewed journal. Richards' study drew on sources from

Bristol Archives, Bristol Cathedral, and St. Mary Redcliffe to examine changing historiography regarding enslaver and philanthropist Edward Colston in the west of England.

While Richards' article did not win the top prize, the publications committee wrote that it did "merit recognition for excellent and timely scholarship." Richards is a member of <u>St. Thomas' Episcopal Church</u> in Canonsburg.





### Rest in Peace: The Rev. Canon James D. Von Dreele

The Rev. Canon James D. Von Dreele, 74, died in Seasons Hospice at Wilmington Hospital in Wilmington, DE, Friday, July 23, 2021, after a long illness. He was 74 years old.

Jim+ was the rector at St. Matthew's Episcopal Church in Homestead from 1976 to 1996. During this time, he was active in an inter-denominational group of clergy and labor union members challenging corporate decisions affecting the lives of unemployed families in the Pittsburgh area.



Following his tenure in Homestead, Jim+ was named executive director of the Seamen's Church Institute in Philadelphia. This nonprofit organization provides hospitality and help for the crew members of shipping docked in the Port of Philadelphia. In this position he was an active advocate for seafarer's rights and was also elected president of the North American Maritime Ministry Association.
