Social Justice and Outreach Committee Green Church Grants

This year, the diocesan Social Justice and Outreach Committee (SJO) will award grants of up to \$500, to smaller churches for energy-saving improvements such as changing lights to LED, installing light timers, installing/improving weather stripping or insulation, buying a compost bin or rain barrel, or planting trees or shrubs near the church building to serve as insulation or near your parking lot to add shade.



Applications listing your requests and their expected cost, with the source of the estimate, must be submitted by December 1, 2021. "We're hoping to be open by mid-November," board member Teresa Roberts told me when we met up in the middle of another working Saturday at St. George Anglican Church at 100 Bonar Avenue, Waynesburg. She and husband Scott and daughter Olivia were there with fellow board member Carol Young to get another few hours of moving in chores done. Last year during the pandemic, when its dwindling number of older parishioners couldn't attend, the church reluctantly closed its doors. Ownership reverted to the Episcopal Diocese of Pittsburgh and this spring the church was put up for sale.

"My prayers have always been that it would continue to be used for some type of ministry," church deaconess Barbara McMillan said.
