The Episcopal Diocese of Pittsburgh is seeking an individual with a Bachelor's degree in Accounting or Finance to serve as Treasurer and Director of Administration. This position reports to the Bishop and works closely with the Diocese's parishes and governing bodies. The person serving in this role will be responsible for the administration of all accounting activities; preparing various monthly/annual financial statements, budgets, and reports; coordinating the annual diocesan audit; overseeing the administration of benefits; managing two employees; and other compliance, consulting, and administrative functions.



Candidates must have experience in accounting and advanced knowledge of accounting principles and reporting practices. A CPA is preferred, as well as experience with not-for-profit accounting. The ideal candidate will be familiar with the Episcopal Church and its structures and be able to work well with diocesan and parish leadership and other members of diocesan staff. Additionally, this individual must be proficient with QuickBooks and have excellent verbal and written communication skills.

This is a full-time position of 40+ hours a week. The salary range is \$65,000-\$75,000 and is commensurate with education and background. For more information, view the full job description.

Advent Quiet Day In-Person and Online

A quiet day is a period of respite when time is set aside to be quiet, spend time with God and refresh your spirit for the days ahead. The theme of our 2021 Advent Quiet Day is "The Four Themes of Advent."



The event will consist of alternating periods of meditation and quiet time followed by final prayers and a vegetarian lunch. During quiet time, in-person participants can go to the parish hall, where there will be a collection of books and relaxation activities available or find a quiet spot in the church or offices to read and/or meditate. Online participants should consider the quiet times as sabbath time and be as quiet as possible. Participants are asked not to talk until after the final prayers.

The event is free. All are welcome.

Vestry Note: Changing Parish By-laws

If you are considering updating your parish's by-laws, please be aware that the <u>Canons of the Episcopal Diocese of Pittsburgh</u> establish the following two requirements:

1. A parish vote. Canon XV, Section 5, states, "No alterations in the Articles of Association, Charter, or By-laws, of any Parish shall be made unless approved by a majority of votes of the members of the Parish qualified to vote for members of the Vestry and who are present at a meeting called on due notice." Typically, such votes



- occur at an annual parish meeting, but a special meeting may also be called for the purpose of approving by-law changes.
- 2. **Standing Committee approval.** Canon XV, Section 2, states, "Neither the Articles of Association nor the Charter and By-laws of any Parish shall be changed without the consent of the Convention or of the Standing Committee."

Additionally, it is customary for our diocesan chancellor to review proposed by-law changes in advance of the request for Standing Committee approval.

Benefits Update for Parishes: Disability Insurance Coverage for Lay Employees

Did you know that Lay employees who work 20 or more hours per week qualify for disability insurance through Church Pension Group (CPG)?



Parishes may enroll in either Employer-Paid or Employee-Paid coverage for short and/or long-term disability insurance coverage for their lay

employees only. Parishes are encouraged to investigate the options for providing disability coverage to lay employees to provide parity with clergy who are covered for both short and long-term disability as part of the benefits provided for clergy by CPG.
