Diane L. Duntley, 80, of Indiana, died Tuesday, May 17, 2022, following a brief illness.

The Burial Office and Eucharist for Diane will be **Saturday, June 4 at 2 p.m., at Christ Church, Indiana** (902 Philadelphia Street Indiana, PA). An extended prelude on the Kilgen-Brunner pipe organ will precede the liturgy, beginning at 1:30 p.m. Diane played a key role in the renovation and installation of this instrument, but never got to hear it in person herself.

For more than 40 years Diane served Christ Church and the diocese on many governing bodies and advisory committees, most recently as Chair of the Diocesan Life Commission and as Diocesan Coordinator for Episcopal Relief and Development.

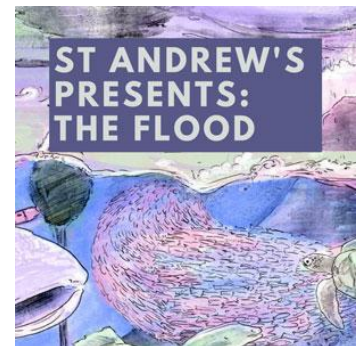
St. Andrew's, Highland Park VBS 2022: The Flood
