\$1.68m Regional Medical Debt Forgiven by "Let's be a Blessing" Campaign




Help Release Our Neighbors' Medical Debt October 2022

Our goal was \$5,000. We raised \$6,704. By partnering with RIP Medical Debt, we

reached out in love to abolish our neighbors' medical debt in western PA, eastern OH, and northern WV.

1,615 neighbors helped \$1,683,990.73 medical debt forgiven





It's no hoax!

Letters promising medical debt cancellation arriving in 1,615 mailboxes throughout western Pennsylvania, eastern Ohio, and northern West Virginia. are the real deal.

Episcopalians in Washington County recently purchased and forgave \$1.68 million in regional medical debts with no strings attached.

St. Thomas' Church in Canonsburg and St. David's Church in Peters Township launched their debt forgiveness campaign called "Let's be a Blessing" in June.

"Personally, I get such a feeling of joy in thinking about folks getting a letter in the mail telling them that their debt has been forgiven when they weren't expecting it or probably ever thinking that something like that could happen. It's all grace! If setting those held captive by crushing debt isn't the Gospel, I'm not sure what is," according to the Rev. Canon Cathy Brall who leads the Canonsburg congregation.

On September 25, **the Rev. Dr. Julie Smith** ended her time as Youth Education Director at St. Brendan's, Franklin Park. Julie continues her ministry as a chaplain at Caring Hospice Services. She also serves as a supply priest, filling in the gaps, as needed, at parishes throughout the Diocese.
