Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's 2023 Christmas Message: 'A sign for you'

Presiding Bishop Michael Curry has released his annual Christmas message saying that he is grateful for all of the prayers as he recovers from his latest surgery.

Curry underwent emergency surgery on Dec. 4 after doctors diagnosed a subdural hematoma, or brain bleed, that he suffered after falling during a visit to the Diocese of



Central New York. He has since been released from the hospital in Raleigh, North Carolina, where he lives.

In his Christmas message, Curry said he was doing well and is "ever more aware of the power of the messages of Advent to watch, to wait, and to listen to the pregnant voice of silence."




St. Andrew's Launches Search for Next Rector






A Last Minute Gift Idea from the Bookstore at Calvary



The Internal Revenue Service has issued the 2024 optional standard mileage rates used to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business, charitable, medical or moving purposes. Beginning on Jan. 1, 2024, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car (also vans, pickups or panel trucks) will be:

- 67 cents per mile driven for business use, up 1.5 cents from 2023.
- 21 cents per mile driven for medical or moving purposes for qualified active-duty members of the Armed Forces, a decrease of 1 cent from 2023.
- 14 cents per mile driven in service of charitable organizations; the rate is set by statute and remains unchanged from 2023.

These rates apply to electric and hybrid-electric automobiles as well as gasoline and diesel-powered vehicles.
